This training is vital in providing an ongoing safe and secure learning environment for the staff and students and as stated earlier is mandatory for all DoE employees. This session along with Wednesday of Week 6 is in lieu of a Staff development Day at the end of the year.

Alteration To Staff Development Day Dates

Along with the above alteration there is another change of dates on the cards. Next term, Term 2, we generally have a SDD on the first Monday back and then students return on the Tuesday; we then have a similar scenario in Term 3. What I propose is that we have 2 SDD's next term, Monday and Tuesday then

students return on The Wednesday, and then in Term 3 students simply return on the Monday and there is no SDD. The reason for the change is to complete AVID training, which usually involves flying to Melbourne and is a very costly exercise. This way all staff will receive the training and the cost to the school will be minimised. This is a collective approach by all the Primary and High Schools in town and the exact same scenarios will be in place in all DoE schools this year. 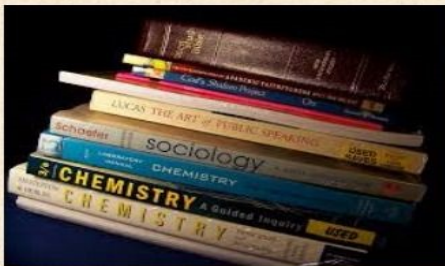

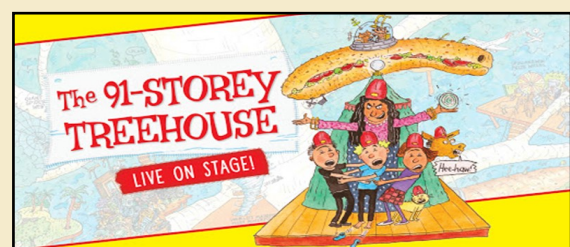
